## The GoodCities Process

What makes GoodCities stand apart from the rest is that our total focus is on leadership development in the local context. This means that what matters to the leaders of a city or community matters to us.

We start with a corps of leaders from the Christian community and we ask them questions revealing their inner drive to serve. We help them learn processes that expand their circles of engagement to bring those they influence into critical places of service as well. This is known as leveraging *social capital*.

I've recently started a community of practice that helps me live out this kind of unity. It's called *Businesses Doing Good*.

It started when Scott Myers sponsored my involvement at the UN's Fourth Global Forum on Flourishing Business at Case Western Reserve University's Weatherhead School of Management

held June 14-16. The speakers made it clear that businesses are moving from reducing their ecological footprint to proactively doing good in cities and communities. In

some cases, solving a social problem has become the center of their business model. People are now being employed full time where once only very part time volunteers were working.



In August we launched a series of conference calls held on the 3rd Thursday of each month at 10 a.m. Central with a guest interview and an open forum featuring a different business example each time. Check our website for recordings of previous calls and for upcoming call topics and guests. On January 18, two of the top executives with Caribou Coffee will discuss Rainforest Alliance Certification.

When we held our first face-to-face meeting on October 20-21, it became clear that both people of faith and people of good will are interested in ways that businesses can benefit local communities. This was a rich meeting where ideas and beliefs were openly shared as we discussed different ways

that each of the participants were working to have their businesses benefit their community.

Scott Myers of Akron has taken a family company and turned it into GoodPlace Holdings, a business that incubates start-ups and provides a stable back office for social entrepreneurs seeking to provide employment to some of the most vulnerable populations in their city.



Scott Barr sees himself as the Steward of Southwest Siding in San Antonio. He has started a shared administrative and bookkeeping center for contractors that he calls Our Father's Business.

## City Impact Accelerator

### Building a Better Community

GoodCities is offering a major building block for building good cities: the City Impact Accelerator. In two cities twelve locally-selected teams from multiple domains (e.g. churches, government, businesses, nonprofits, education groups, etc.) will experience a proven collaboration process that speeds problem-to-solution innovation and implementation. This will result in positive impacts on societal issues such as literacy, job creation, healthcare, and other issues of interest to the cohort.

These cohorts will be led by Glenn Barth and Reggie McNeal. GoodCities is excited about this approach that weds the strengths of anchor churches with marketplace and community leaders to serve the city. GoodCities leads through results-based conversations that facilitate an appreciative inquiry process to bring deeply-owned results.

### City Gospel Movement Team

At GoodCities, we not only teach collaborative leadership, we practice it. In recent years, a number of significant organizations have recognized that God is doing a great work in bringing Christian leaders together to impact cities with the gospel of the kingdom.

May 15-17, 2017, leaders from fourteen ministries influencing leaders of gospel movements in cities gathered in Estes Park, CO to form the City Gospel Movement Team. These leaders are pictured above. Together we are collaborating to better understand and serve this movement that God is growing.



During our time together we got to know each other better and came to understand more deeply how we can work together. I'm thankful for these fellow workers in God's field and am glad to know that we are on this journey together.

### Unite Greater Dallas City Convene

Unite Greater Dallas held a City Convene that began with breakfast at the Westin Galleria. Mayor Mike Rawlings (pictured with Unite's Executive Director, Rebecca Walls) spoke to the 350 pastors, business and nonprofit leaders with a spirit of gratitude for the healing work that pastors entered into following



the tragic ambush and murder of five police officers on July 7, 2016. By 3 a.m.

on July 8,

a decision was made to have a prayer vigil at noon. Mayor Rawlings said, "One of the most uplifting days of my life was when we had that interdenominational prayer meeting!"

"Out of it came a reconciliation process between the police and Black leaders." He urged the leaders to keep showing the bigger church to the city.

with existing effective initiatives and to create new initiatives that harness the power of collective impact.

In this way, people of faith gain the confidence they need to work together with people of good will for the good of their city. Through this process, friendships are formed and Christians begin to have an incarnational witness.

Last year in Springfield, MO, the City Manager and a few of the leading Pastors called together the pastors of over 150 churches, who committed themselves and their congregations to serve school and education initiatives in underperforming districts, to form partnerships with churches already serving poor neighborhoods, and to provide workforce development opportunities.

Our work has lasting impact. Processes we initiated with leadership teams seven to ten years ago continue to bear fruit today. In Modesto, CA churches team together with the County Department of Mental Health to help people leave drug and alcohol addictions through Recovery Modesto. In Atlanta, Unite is strengthening families, fighting child sex trafficking and improving educational outcomes.

To date, through our conferences and coaching, over 150 cities have been impacted by our work. In short, GoodCities is uniquely suited to advance community solutions in our time.

## *A City Set in a Valley?*

In Happy Valley, City Church of State College lets its light shine without being "...a city set on a hill." Dan Nold, Senior Pastor of Calvary Church and the leader of City Church says that the valley really resembles its name. It is a smaller city (population 42,034) in the center of Pennsylvania. The population swells each year with the influx of approximately 32,000 students at Penn State University. State College and the surrounding cities and towns together have a population of 236,577 in Centre County.

I met with Dan over coffee at the Good Day Cafe in Minneapolis. City Church is really a fellowship of church leaders in State College who have developed a rhythm of meeting and serving together. Dan is confident and humble, and with some prodding, he told me about some significant spiritual and social impacts of this group. Here are a few he mentioned.

- Rhythm of Prayer — 12 pastors meet weekly for prayer for the city.
- Monthly strategy sessions — 18 to 20 participants
- City Serve — 18-20 churches cancel their church services on a designated Sunday to serve their community
- Center County Orphan Care Alliance 30 to 40 churches offering foster care and adoption working with Centre County DHS.
- Out of the Cold — 15 to 20 churches providing housing, meals, and employment, for the homeless.
